
## What's Required for Effective Standards Development?

- Well developed proposals
- Input / participation from stakeholders
- Expert involvement at the table
- Tolerance for opposing opinions
- Understanding the issues before voting
- Well disseminated information

   for proper development?
  - Does a work group already exist that can handle the proposal?
- Should there be a special effort to bring in stakeholders to NCWM meetings for this proposal?

#### Proposal Review Checklist

- A concise statement of the issue or problem outlining the purpose and national need for its consideration.
- Background material including test data, analysis of test data, or other appropriately researched and documented material from which the Committee will be able to make a judgment for either a firm recommendation or consideration of the need for further study;
- Proposed solutions to problems stated in specific language in amendment form to Conference documents.
- Practical, realistic, and specific recommendations for both regulations and test methods to provide for proper enforcement if a proposal involves a new area of weights and measures activity.
- When proposals modify existing publications, such as Handbook 44, the proposal should:
  - Identify the pertinent portion, section, and paragraph of the existing publication that would be changed (e.g., Sec. 1.10. General Code, paragraphe G-A.1. Commercial and Law-Enforcement Equipment.).
  - Provide evidence of consistency with NCWM publications, such as with other specific device code sections.
  - Provide evidence of consistency with Federal laws and regulations (e.g., USDA)
  - Relay the positions of businesses, industries, or trade associations affected by the proposal including supporting and opposing points of view.

- All proposals forwarded by the regions will appear on the NCWM Standing Committee agenda.
- Committees will present them for comment in the usual manner.
- Committee reports will provide for a historical record of the discussions and actions related to the proposal.
- Ultimate fate of a proposal lies within the standing committees.
